

Are there check in times/points throughout the day?

Students are all together as a whole for the day with the exception of 2-5pm where they have free time to go to the pool/blob/ziplines/etc. or to do tournament style organized games.

Are there any restrictions on phone usage?

Many students bring their phones to use as cameras on the trip, we do ask that they remain off of their phones during Cabin Chats (devotion times) and services, and to be present with their peers instead of engrossed in their phones. Also, cell signal at the camp ground is not good so if you are trying to call their cells it may not come through.

Are there rules to follow at free time or are they on their own during free time. Are they supervised during free time?

During free time students are only allowed at the designated places for that time. They all get a packet with a schedule (as well as a schedule on their cabin door) that lists these places and they have a map to show them how to get to these places. Most places are very centrally located to their cabins. The farthest activity is a 5 minute walk from the cabins. They are not allowed to be anywhere including their cabins by themselves, they must stay in groups at all times. Our leaders are dispersed throughout the campground spending time with students. Some groups may have a leader with them, some might not dependent on how they split up, but all students must stay in a group. We also have people including Spring Hill staff driving around ensuring that no student is alone. Every activity has an adult present.

Is there any separation of ages/gender during free time?

We do not separate ages/gender during free time, although they are not allowed anywhere coupled off.

Are there any safety measures in place for someone who may get separated from their group?

If they get separated from their group they will not be far from another group as everything is close by. They can either continue to where they were going when they lost their group or go to the next closest group and find their first group with them. They do not have to stay in the same group the whole time. Not all students enjoy every activity so we do understand that groups may change throughout free time, we just ask the students to keep in communication with their cabin leaders so they know where they are, and they still have to stay in a group.
